

# Pip's World Book Day Adventure

*Learning objective: To develop reading comprehension skills and explore the importance of storytelling through creative writing and illustration.*

Read the passage about Pip the caterpillar's favourite day of the year. Answer the questions below to test your understanding, then use your imagination to complete the colouring activity.

World Book Day is the most exciting day of the year for Pip. As a bookworm caterpillar, Pip spends all morning arranging the library shelves to make sure every book is in the perfect spot. Today, Pip has invited all the BookFlik friends to the Great Oak Tree for a story party. Everyone has dressed up as a character from their favourite book. Max the monkey is wearing a cape, Zara the zebra has painted colourful patterns on her costume to look like a magical forest, and Ellie the elephant is ready to tell a historical tale from memory. Pip believes that every book is a doorway to a new world. 'With just a few pages,' Pip says with a cheerful wiggle, 'you can visit the moon, sail the seven seas, or travel back in time!'

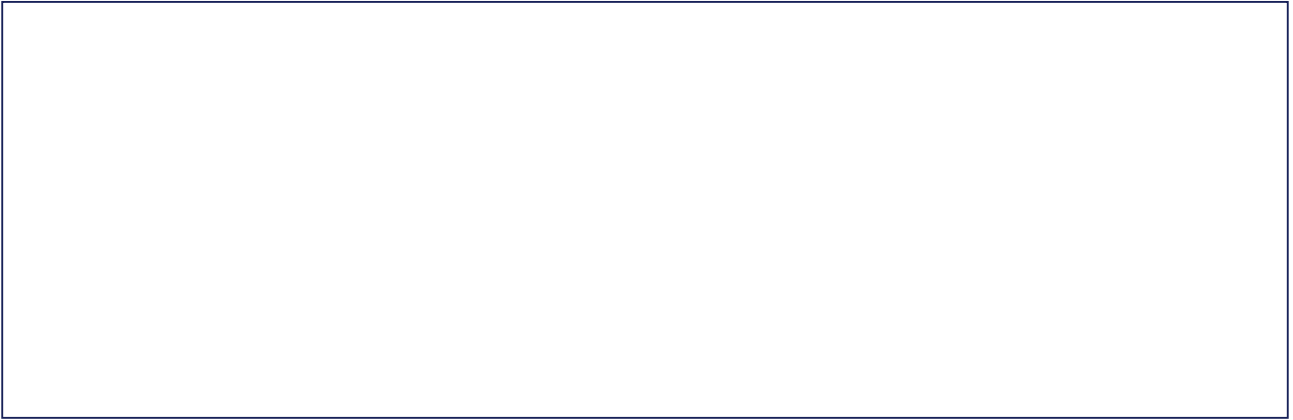
**5. If you were going to the Great Oak Tree party, which book character would you choose to dress up as and why? (2 marks)**
