

Max's Easter Market Maths

Learning objective: To solve addition, subtraction, and multiplication problems involving money in the context of an Easter market.

Help Max the monkey work out the prices at the Easter stall. Show your working out clearly for each calculation to earn full marks.

Max is helping organise the Great Spring Market. He has a stall selling colourful Easter treats. A bag of chocolate-shaped eggs costs £1.25. A handmade spring bonnet costs £4.50. A bunch of daffodils costs £2.10. Max needs to make sure he gives the right change to every customer.

Word bank: total · change · calculate · multiply · difference · pence · pounds

1. A customer buys two bags of chocolate-shaped eggs. How much does the customer spend in total? (2 marks)

2. If a customer pays for a spring bonnet (£4.50) with a £10 note, how much change should Max give them? (2 marks)

3. How much more does a spring bonnet cost than a bunch of daffodils? (2 marks)

4. Max sells 5 bunches of daffodils. How much money has he made from the daffodils altogether? (2 marks)

5. If a customer buys one bag of eggs and one bunch of daffodils, what is the total cost? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Max's market stall, showing at least three items for sale with their price tags written in pounds and pence.



Extension challenge: Max decides to offer a 'Spring Bundle' consisting of one bonnet, two bags of eggs, and one bunch of daffodils. If he applies a 50p discount to the total price, what is the new price of the bundle?
